



16-19 Tuition Funding Guidance

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is funding for the 2020 to 2021 and 2021 to 2022 academic year. It is ring fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 providers to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19).

The funding is being provided to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted, including vocational and/or academic learning. Although the actual tuition does not need to be for GCSE English or maths, students will be prioritised where they had not achieved grade 5 or above in at least one of those subjects at this level by age 16. All supported students must be on a 16 to 19 study programme. Special regard will be given for the needs of students with special education needs and disabilities (SEND), particularly where they have experienced additional disruption to learning as a result of their specific needs.

Small Group Tuition	This arrangement will enable the teacher to focus exclusively on a number of small learners, usually in separate classrooms, working areas or virtually over and above the school timetable. Saturday School Catch up Sessions.	This will enable students to receive catch up support for vocational and academic subjects where time has been missed due to having to isolate or needing SEN support. Mentoring Support	This will involve an experienced representative working with young people who may be struggling with their studies due to a lack of confidence, resilience and low aspirations. Revision Guides	Students who have not yet passed their GCSE Maths and or English GCSE examination/s have been entered for Level 2 Functional Skills as a GCSE equivalent course. This is an intervention put into place to not only support the students in gaining a recognised GCSE equivalent qualification but also to enhance prospects of progressing onto Higher Education where the qualification is a requisite. Students will also be supported with revision guides for their Level 3 subjects where they have content to revisit that may have been delivered virtual or during bouts of staff and/or student absence.	Additional resource/s provided to students sitting the Functional Skills examination as a Level 2 GCSE equivalent qualification.
