I am sure you will join me in congratulating all those appointed to their roles and we look forward to working with our whole academy team to drive through further improvements.

Curriculum

We are also undergoing some positive changes to the curriculum offer for KS3 to ensure that students have access to the broadest possible curriculum including full exposure to the technology and Arts subjects. The changes will come into effect from January when students will be issued with new timetables.

Furthermore, I would ask all parents to get behind our philosophy of '**keep up, not catch up**'. This is significantly important as any missed learning or learning which has not been fully formed will build towards greater and deeper issues later in our students' education. Therefore, if your child has been invited to a 'Curriculum Plus' intervention after school (these are personalised invitations based on individual pupil need), it is expected that your child attends. You can support this by reminding them about the session and the expectation

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that they stay in order for the teacher to help fill any knowledge or skills gaps before they then move onto the next stage of learning.

Our learning planning is cyclical and knowledge and skills build and layer, topic after topic, across all our subjects. If your child is invited to a Curriculum + session, it means they are at risk of having significant gaps in their learning which once missed, will be hard to retrace and could have an impact on future learning which relies on this piece of knowledge or understanding. Again, please support us in ensuring that your children attend these carefully planned and selected sessions to ensure that they are ready for the next sequence in their learning journey, thank you ③

Academy Enrichment:

I wanted to list just a few of some of the amazing things our staff and students have been doing this term - this is not exhaustive but gives you a flavour of all we have been doing with and for our students:
