What do Ambassadors do......

- Ambassadors fulfil a crucial role in our governance structure.
- They, in part, replace the Local Governing Body model with the intent that the 'good' innovative work can be carried out by them with an absolute focus on the Academy and education.
- This leaves much of the legal and administrative work continuing to be carried out from within the trust.
- Ambassadors are a key resource for Head Teachers to reach out into the community.
- Ambassador Chairs can be the Head Teachers critical friend.
- They have £1,000 per annum to work on projects that will benefit your Academy.





E-ACT Ambassador Role

- To sustain the link between the local community and academy leaders
- Promote the work of the Academy and its pupils and support events
- Have a role with complaints, hearing, and permanent exclusion panels. Training on how to do this will be provided.
- Attendance at Review Days
- Attendance on Ambassador Conferences and other opportunities to network with other Ambassadors to collaborate and support you in your role.

The work of our volunteer Ambassadors, which is part of our Governance structure is crucial in connecting our E-ACT academies with the communities we serve. We are proud of the dedication and commitment of our Ambassadors who continue in finding ways to support our academies through stakeholder engagement. The stakeholders are Staff; Community; Students and Parents.



Each academy will have a Chair and a minimum of 2 parent Ambassadors, with 2 staff Ambassadors and 2 Community Ambassadors. Other members can include alumni members, student council members and key community leaders.



Ambassadors are advocates for our pupils and academies and by working with our headteachers and senior leaders, shape and develop the representation of E-ACT academies in the local area and nationally.
